Charles Dickens is one of the most famous of all English writers. His books are known and loved all over the world. He was born on February 7, 1812, in a shabby little house in Port Sea, on the south coast of England. His father was an underpaid

civilian clerk to the navy, and the family was always poor, always in debt. Charles was taken out of school when he was 11, since there was no money to pay the fees. When his father went to prison for debt, the 12 year-old boy had to work in a factory. Working 12 hours a day, Charles Dickens earned a dollar a week. The miseries and hardships of his childhood are described in his novel *David Copperfield* (1849-50), whose early chapters are largely his own story.
